INFO: American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) is a lobbying group which uncritically support Israel's war on Gaza, but it does not directly contribute to candidates. See the Open Secrets page https://www.opensecrets.org/orgs/american-israel-public-affairs-cmte/recipients?id=D000046963 for a compilation of donations by individuals with close ties to AIPAC. Among Washington State Congress members, Senator Cantwell leads the pack with \$134 thousand in AIPAC-connected donations for the 2024 election cycle. Would this be a disincentive for her to support an immediate ceasefire? [Yes, that is a rhetorical question.]

WOMEN & WAR VIRTUAL FILM FESTIVAL

Through March 23, online

Marking International Women's Day (March 8), this year's "Women & War" virtual film festival, explores the intersection of women, war, and militarized masculinity.

The film fest begins with the newly released Israelism about the portrayal of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict in American Jewish institutions; followed by Naila and The Uprising about the central role Palestinian women played in the First Intifada; and concluding with the 2022 release of Power on Patrol from Women's International League for Peace & Freedom (WILPF) exploring how militarised masculinities play out around the world and the stories of the male allies doing vital work alongside female activists to achieve equitable peace, in Africa, the Middle East, and Latin America.

TRASH: A POOR WHITE JOURNEY BOOK LAUNCH EVENT WITH PANEL

Sat March 16, 2-4 pm, at Plymouth Church 1217 Sixth Avenue, Seattle, WA 98101 or online at https://vimeo.com/event/4152815

Book launch with panel discussion for "Trash: A Poor White Journey" by Cedar Monroe, with foreword by Liz Theoharis, Co-Chair of the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival, who will be part of the panel. The author, Cedar Monroe, has been involved with the Poor People's Campaign since its (re)launch in 2018 and has a compelling story to educate us on the realities of the lives of desperate poor people in the Aberdeen area as well as providing a cogent analysis of the underlying causes.

Monroe introduces us to people who are poor and unhoused in a small town in Washington, who eke out a living on land that once provided timber for the nation. On the banks of the Chehalis River, we meet residents of the largest homeless encampment in the county, who face sweeps and evictions and are targeted by vigilantes before bringing their case to federal court. We watch a community grapple with desperation, government neglect, and its own racism. From visits to jails, flophouses, tent cities, and on trips to hospitals and funeral homes, we see leaders forging connections between their people and the global movement to end poverty.

With trenchant insight born of liberation theology, radical politics, and an even more radical hope, Monroe introduces us to people hammering out survival strategies and hope in the abandoned zones of empire. Capitalism and colonialism have stolen land from Indigenous people, forced workers into dangerous jobs, and then left them to die when their labor was no longer needed. But what would happen if poor white folks rejected the empty promises of white supremacy and embraced solidarity with other poor people? What if they joined the resistance to the system that is, slowly or quickly, killing us all? Trash asks us to see anew the peril in which poor white people live and the choices we all must make.

ISRAELI APARTHEID IN ACTION: WATER CONTROL

Sun March 17, noon Pacific Time, Zoom

Controlling the supply, distribution, and cost of water to an occupied people is apartheid in action. Israel, through legal and illegal means, maintains near-complete control over the region's freshwater aquifers, severely restricting Palestinians' abilities to drill wells, install pumps, build water tanks, or even collect rainwater. The average Israeli consumes over 3 times the water used by Palestinian on the water grid in the West Bank (9 times the water used by those off the grid). West Bank Palestinians pay 1/3 or more of their income to Israeli companies for drinking water. Meanwhile, Gazans are now consuming less than 3 liters per day—hardly enough for survival.

VFHL offers three short videos describing the "hydropolitics" and structural water apartheid in the Holy Land. Our panel discussion will explore designed inequalities in water distribution; the physical, economic and regulatory controls; as well as the ecological problems of pollution and over-extraction

DEMAND ADAM SMITH SUPPORTS GAZA CEASEFIRE AT TOWNHALL

We will meet up at 10 am to get signs to bring in, at the Sammamish High School school parking lot right behind the bus stop (on the east side of 140th Ave SE, between SE 1st & 2nd Streets) & head over at 10:30 to be guaranteed we get in. Event starts at 11 am. Congressman Adam Smith, representing Washington's 9th congressional district (including all of South Seattle and parts of the Central District), will be holding his first public appearance since October 7th. Smith is the top Democrat on the House Armed Services Committee and has continued to support unconditional military aid to Israel, allowing it to increase the death, destruction, and humanitarian disaster in Gaza. For over five months he has provided unwavering support for Israel's unrelenting attacks and war crimes on Gaza, along with Israel's brutal cutoff of food, water, power, and medical supplies to the Gaza strip. Despite many of us having repeated meetings with his aides over the last five months, and some of us being arrested in his office on January 26th waiting to speak directly to him, he has not only rejected our pleas but has grossly mischaracterized our requests and intentions (grossly and intentionally calling our demands for a ceasefire equivalent to Israel not doing "anything to try to stop them from doing Oct. 7 again"). This may be our only opportunity to confront Rep. Smith on his moral abdication, cowardice, and his intentional spread of disinformation, while providing Israel with the means to continue the death and destruction.

CELEBRATING FRAGMENTS OF FRAGMENTS: DEMOCRACY AND THE WEST BANK

T'ruah, the Rabbinic Call for Human Rights presents:

Join us to honor the publication of Fragments of Fragments and to deepen a conversation about the occupation in the West Bank in the context of the present war. Professor Shaul Magid and graduating rabbinical student Aliza Schwartz will be our speakers in an intergenerational conversation that begins with their articles in Fragments - --about the legacy of Meir Kahane in Israeli politics and culture, and about Palestinian life under occupation in the West Bank -- and moves from there to the current war.

Aliza Schwartz is a rabbinical student at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, expecting to graduate this May. She is a member of T'ruah's Board of Directors, and she was a T'ruah Israel Fellow in 2021-2022. She worked for three and a half years at the New Israel Fund as Assistant Director for the New England Region. She has been a strategy coach and trainer for IfNotNow, mostly in the movement's early years.

Shaul Magid is Professor of Jewish Studies at Dartmouth College, Senior Fellow at the Center for World Religions at Harvard, Kogod Senior Fellow at the Shalom Hartman Institute of North America, and in 2023-2024 the Visiting Professor of Modern Judaism at Harvard University. His latest books are "Meir Kahane: The Public Life and Political Thought of an American Jewish Radical" (Princeton, 2021) and "The Necessity of Exile: Essays from a Distance" (Ayin, 2023). He is presently working on a book on the political theology of R. Yoel Teitelbaum of Satmar.

CEASEFIRE AND BEYOND: WHAT'S HAPPENING IN PALESTINE/ISRAEL & ITS IMPACT Q&A

Tues March 19, 6-7:30 pm Pacific time, Zoom

The Peace and Justice Action League of Spokane (PJALS) invites you to participate in this facilitated Q&A session with Sabrene Odeh and Alice Rothchild, both Pacific Northwest peace advocates with extensive knowledge of the present situation in Palestine and Israel and its history.

Sabrene Odeh is the co-founder of Baladna, an organization created for Palestinian community, organizing, and advocacy. TRASH: A POOR WHITE JOURNEY BOOK LAUNCH EVENT WITH PANEL READING, Q&A, SIGNING

Book launch for "Trash: A Poor White Journey" by Cedar Monroe, with foreword by Liz Theoharis, Co-Chair of the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival. The author, Cedar Monroe, has been involved with the Poor People's Campaign since its (re)launch in 2018 and has a compelling story to educate us on the realities of the lives of desperate poor people in the Aberdeen area as well as providing a cogent analysis of the underlying causes.

Monroe introduces us to people who are poor and unhoused in a small town in Washington, who eke out a living on land that once provided timber for the nation. On the banks of the Chehalis River, we meet residents of the largest homeless encampment in the county, who face sweeps and evictions and are targeted by vigilantes before bringing their case to federal court. We watch a community grapple with desperation, government neglect, and its own racism. From visits to jails, flophouses, tent cities, and on trips to hospitals and funeral homes, we see leaders forging connections between their people and the global movement to end poverty.

With trenchant insight born of liberation theology, radical politics, and an even more radical hope, Monroe introduces us to people hammering out survival strategies and hope in the abandoned zones of empire. Capitalism and colonialism have stolen land from Indigenous people, forced workers into dangerous jobs, and then left them to die when their labor was no longer needed. But what would happen if poor white folks rejected the empty promises of white supremacy and embraced solidarity with other poor people? What if they joined the resistance to the system that is, slowly or quickly, killing us all? Trash asks us to see anew the peril in which poor white people live and the choices we all must make.

Everyone is welcome to join us for a Zoom conference with speakers, workshops, and discussion."

We are delighted to announce that peace activist and pacifist Kathy Kelley will be our keynote speaker. Kathy has been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize three times. She cofounded Voices in the Wilderness, which had a major educational and advocacy role in opposing the deadly US sanctions against Iraq. Later she continued her anti-war work with Voices for Creative Nonviolence. She has spent time in war zones and refugee settlements documenting the effects of wars in Nicaragua, Haiti, Bosnia, Iraq, Afghanistan, Gaza, and Pakistan. Kathy has been imprisoned for refusing to pay war taxes, fined for illegal acts of compassion in Iraq, and is now protesting the US-funded war against Palestinian people.

Kathy has also protested the US use of killer drones, training of human rights abusers at the School of the Americas, and US use of torture at Guantanamo. She is currently involved with the Merchants of Death War Crimes Tribunal, highlighting the profit-driven manufacture of weapons and the lobbying by their makers.
