As the International Court of Justice considers South Africa's case against Israeli genocide, CODEPINK explores the legal and political implications of putting Israel on trial for genocide. VOICES FROM THE HOLY LAND FILM: SCREENING OF ISRAELISM

Israel is central to the political and cultural life of the American Jewish community. But it has also become a deeply divisive subject, as painful generational cracks have emerged within the Jewish community over the Israel-Palestine conflict, inspiring argument, protest and even censorship.

Focusing on the stories of two young Americans raised to defend Israel at all costs, Israelism traces their awakening to Israel's dehumanization of Palestinians and the ongoing violence of the occupation. The film explores the past, present, and future of the relationship between American Jews and Israel, as growing numbers question whether support for Israel should condition and define their Jewish identity. Featuring a range of American Jewish thinkers, community leaders and activists, Israelism asks how and why Israel became the cornerstone of American Judaism, what the consequences have been, and what will happen as divisions continue to grow.

Despite the escalated violence imposed on Palestinians, they persist. Palestinians have resorted to developing small agricultural plots and construction jobs to survive during this time. This move back to

agriculture, even if temporarily, reflects the variety of skills and steadfastness Palestinians possess. Tariq, whose income has been deeply affected by the lack of tourism, implores non-Palestinians to come visit to truly understand how Palestinians are forced to live. He says, "They [Zionists] have created this false image about Palestinians and our lives. To understand who we are and how we live under occupation, you have to come see for yourself. Then you will see how hard it is for me, as a Palestinian, to try to live or even pray in Al-Aqsa Mosque."

For Tariq and many other Palestinians like him, one of the strongest ways people can support Palestine is by bearing witness to the horrors of their daily lives and using that experience to speak truth in the face of intentional misrepresentations of Palestine.

WE CHARGE GENOCIDE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF ACTION PERMANENT CEASEFIRE NOW

Fri Jan 26, Everywhere

Join in a Day of Action on January 26 to amplify pressure on the targets of a lawsuit brought against President Biden, Secretary Blinken, and Secretary Austin for their failure to prevent – and complicity in – Israel's unfolding genocide of Palestinians in the Gaza Strip.

Palestinians in Gaza and the U.S., together with our partners at the Center for Constitutional Rights filed a lawsuit last November seeking an emergency court order to halt U.S. support for Israel's genocide. On December 8, the U.S. government responded, and are unsurprisingly

attempting to evade legal responsibility, saying their participation in this genocide is a policy rather than legal question. On January 26, while lawyers for Palestinians will be urging the court to end military support to Israel, we call on you to take action wherever you are to ramp up the pressure on Biden, Blinken and Austin.

The law is on our side, morality is on our side, and the multitude is with Palestine, but it will be an uphill battle.

Our partners continue to pursue this case with urgency on behalf of millions who are enduring the devastating effects of Israel's rampage. U.S. government leaders have the power and the legal responsibility to stop the genocide. And the court has the authority to force them to do so. If powerful countries are not held to their human rights obligations to prevent genocide, the law must be taken into the streets.
